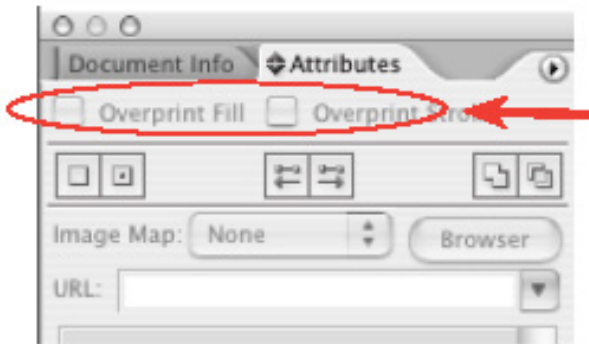


Overprint Awareness

Adobe Illustrator

When working in Illustrator, make sure the Attributes dialog box is open. This will allow you to know if any

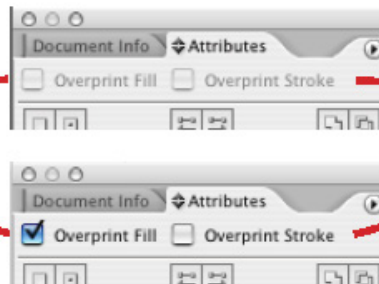
of the objects you have created have overprints applied. You do not want to overprint any objects in your design.



Always Deselected

Especially when the item is WHITE (see example below). When the "overprinted" EPS is placed in InDesign, the overprint will be honored and will have the same result.

How it looks in Illustrator:



How it looks in Acrobat:

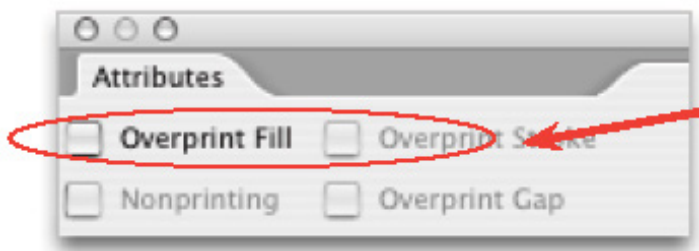


To see the above illustration in Acrobat you must have overprint preview on. For more information on overprint preview see Tech Note 18.

Overprint Awareness (cont.)

Adobe InDesign

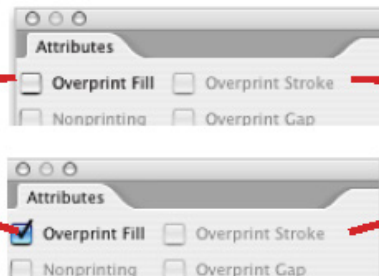
The same thing can happen when working in InDesign. Be sure to have the attributes box open and deselect Overprint Fill or Stroke



Always Deselected

InDesign won't allow overprinting white when it is created in the application.
